The Club understands that occasionally an errant round might damage range equipment (walls, ceiling, evacuation fans, target backstops and baffles, lights and deflectors). When this happens, it is often the case that the range needs to be shut down for safety or repair thus denying its use to other members.

Should you experience or cause such an event you should do the following and expect the Club to also do the following:

If you create such damage, stop what you and your guests might be doing and assess whether if continued shooting might cause additional damage or render the range unsafe. If that is the case put away your firearms and depart the range. Before leaving, leave a conspicuous note or sign of the damage so follow-on users are warned. Contact the Rangemaster via cell phone at the number listed in the range immediately and report the incident even if you do not know the full extent of the damage. Once the Range Master has had an opportunity to assess the damage, he will decide what needs to be done and whether the range can be used in the interim before repairs are made.

To provide as much consistency in the responses and to take any sense of arbitrariness out of the equation you can expect the following to happen:

- If you immediately admit to causing the damage and it was not due to unsafe procedures or fooling around, essentially a true accident, you can expect that the Club will make any necessary repairs and you will be permitted to continue using the range once repaired at no personal expense.
- If you do not report the damage immediately and we have to identify you through means at our disposal, then you will be charged for repairs and you will be charged a fine of \$100 in addition to the cost of repair. Your range privileges will be suspended until you are fully paid up. If you continue to maintain that you are 'not guilty' despite the evidence your membership in the Club will be terminated.
- If you deliberately caused the damage or were performing some inadvisable maneuver that you should have known better not to do that resulted in damage and you told the Club about it, you can expect to pay for the repair before resuming range privileges but your range access and Club membership will not be terminated as long as you assure us that no further such maneuvers will be attempted.
